Door Mr. Jennewein:

The following Information is being submitted in support of the Application for Exemption and in response to the Internal Revenue Service letter dated June 7, 2001.

Number references are to references in such letter.

- There is no purchase agreement between the Keisers and Everglades College with respect to
 the transfer of the College. This was a charitable contribution of the entire educational
 facility.
- There was no payment, either cash or deferred, to the Keisers by Everglades College. -
- The assets and fiabilities of Everglades College transferred, in toto, by the Keisers to Everglades College are shown on the balance sheet attached as Exhibit 3.
- There is no management agreement between Everglades Management, Inc. and Everglades College. There is no fee charged to Everglades College by Everglades Management, Inc.
- Each school is differentiated by its accrediting agency, its governance board and its separate legal structures.

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Keiser College is a private, for-profit Junior college offering Associate degrees. It is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools.

Keiser Career Institute is a diploma granting institution accredited by the Commission of Occurational Education.

Everglades College is a private, not-for-profit, college offering Baccalaureate and Associate degrees. It is accredited by the Accrediting Commission of Career Schools and Colleges of Technology.

- 6. There is no loan agreement between Keiser College and Everglades College. There are no loan agreements outstanding with Everglades College. Certain services and materials were provided from time to time for the benefit of Everglades College, which are repaid. These services and materials are provided on open account, without loan agreements, and represent short-term obligations, regularly repaid. For example, Keiser College paid for the development of on-line course development for Everglades College as it had expertise and was doing it for itself. Charges for this service have subsequently been repaid by Everglades College.
- There are no loan or note agreements between Everglades Management, Inc. and Everglades
 College. Certain services or supplies have been provided on open account and are repaid
 from time to time. fixamples of such services or materials supplied by Everglades
 Management, Inc. are legal fees, printing expenses, academic registrations, advertising
 expenses.
- 8. All paid faculty and staff members and efficers of Keiser College, Keiser Career Institute, Keiser Management, Inc. and Everglades College are employees of Oasis Outsourcing, Inc. No Directors are compensated. The following paid staff members of Keiser College, Keiser Career Institute and Keiser Management, Inc. perfarm services for Everglades College but receive no compensation from Everglades College for such service; Dr. Arthur Keiser, Keiser College President; Carole Fuller, Keiser College Assistant Vice President-Administration; Brian Woods, Keiser College Vice President-Farollment Management; James Savin, Keiser College Controller; and Dr. Gery Hochanadel, Keiser College Vice President-Academic Affairs. No paid staff members of Everglades perform services for Keiser College, Keiser Career Institute or Keiser Management, Inc.
 - 9. The entire actual newspaper notice published on May 17, 2001 is enclosed.
