Dear Mr. Jennewein:

The following information is being submitted in support of the Application for Exemption and in response to your letter dated February 16, 2002, a copy of which is attached hereto ("Letter"), requesting additional information.

Set forth below is the information you requested in the same numerical order contained in your Letter.

1. Please be advised that the Memorandum of Understanding dated August 20, 1998 ("Memorandum"), which was entered into by and among Dr. Arthur Keiser ("Dr. Keiser"), Donald D. Harrington, American Flyers College, Inc. ("AFC") and American Flyers Schools, Inc. ("AFS"), is the actual purchase/sales agreement evidencing the purchase of the shares of AFC stock from AFS. There is no other purchase/sales agreement. A copy of this Memorandum was previously provided to Ms. Aletha Bolt, Exempt Organization Agent for the IRS, on March 30, 2001, together with a copy of the duly executed Stock Power, evidencing the transfer of such shares.

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2. The initial advertising costs incurred by Everglades College included costs of preparing brochures and flyers, as well as costs of placing advertisement ads in local newspapers (such as the Miami Herald and the Fort Lauderdale Sun Sentinel) and other periodicals (such as the Employment Guide). Enclosed are copies of brochures and flyers prepared for and used by Everglades College.
3. Everglades Management, Inc. ("Everglades Management") originally provided start-up funds to Everglades College to expand its operation from the Pompano Airport facilities (which was the original location of AFS prior to its conversion to a not-for-profit organization, Everglades College) to its current location at 1500 N.W. 49<sup>th</sup> Street, Suite 600, Fort Lauderdale, Florida. Everglades Management also provided resources to ensure that Everglades College met the student service requirements of the Accrediting Commission of Career Schools and Colleges of Technology (ACCSCCT) in the areas of financial aid processing, student information management and certain selective administrative functions. There were no contracts or written agreements between Everglades Management and Everglades College regarding the provision of these services by Everglades Management for and on behalf of Everglades College, which services were all performed at cost. There are presently no outstanding financial obligations between Everglades College and Everglades Management.
4. The space that Everglades College leases from Keiser College and uses is separate and distinct from that of Keiser College. Everglades College, which is a separate facility located on the sixth floor of the 1500 Building, has its own suite, its own entrance and reception area, its own faculty and administrative offices, its own telephone number, its own furniture and equipment, its own computer lab, its own conference facilities and its own student/staff lounge. A copy of the floor plan was previously provided to Ms. Aletha Holt, Exempt Organization Agent for the IRS, on March 30, 2001. Enclosed are pictures of the current facility used by Everglades College. Please note that Everglades College is currently searching for a new, separate facility for the fall/winter term of 2002/2003.
5. The Board of Trustees of Everglades College is an independent governing body and all of the business and operational activities of Everglades College, including its day-to-day activities and election of officers, are solely the responsibility of the Board of Trustees and not the Board of Directors. See Article IV, Section 2, of the Bylaws.

I respectfully disagree with your statement that the "Trustees are appointed by the Board of Directors" under the Bylaws.

Pursuant to authority granted under Article III, Section 1, of the Bylaws, the Board of Directors appointed the initial Board of Trustees which consisted of the following individuals: (i) Jim Waldman (Vice Mayor of Coconut Creek); (ii) Lipton McKenzie (a minority business owner); (iii) Maria Kondracki (an independent businesswoman); (iv) Kathy McKenzie (Vice President of Bell South); (v) Dr. Joseph Pace (Vice President of Pacific Institute); and (vi) Dr. Arthur Keiser (Chancellor of Everglades College and President of Keiser College). Thus, although two of the three members of the Board of Directors consists of Dr. Keiser and his wife, Belinda Keiser, the only "Keiser" elected to the initial Board of Trustees was Dr. Arthur Keiser.

Under the Bylaws, all subsequent members of the Board of Trustees (with the exception of the President of Everglades College and the Chairman of the Board of Directors who shall serve as members of the Board of Trustees for so long as each such person holds such office) are "nominated" by the Board of Directors and are "elected" by the Board of Trustees. The Board of Directors merely acts as a "search committee" to identify appropriate candidates for the Board of Trustees. Such candidates are then submitted to the Board of Trustees. The Board of Trustees can in its sole and absolute discretion either "elect" one of the candidate(s) to serve as a member of the Board of Trustees or the Board of Trustees can reject the entire slate of candidates in which case the Board of Directors must submit a new slate of candidates for the Board of Trustees.

Accordingly, the Board of Directors do not have the power to ensure that the candidate(s) nominated by the Board of Directors are actually elected to serve on the Board of Trustees, nor does the Board of Directors have any control over the operations of Everglades College. Rather, such control is fully vested in the Board of Trustees. It should also be noted that each member of the Board of Trustees (excluding the President of Everglades College and the Chairman of the Board of Directors) generally serves for a staggered, three (3) year term. Members of the Board of Trustees may be removed only for cause and only by the affirmative vote of at least three members of the Board of Trustees. The Board of Directors do not have the power to remove members of the Board of Trustees.

Thus, I must respectfully disagree with your conclusion that the "Keiser's control the selection of these Trustees" and that the power to "nominate" the members of the

Board of Trustees obviates (circumvents) the independence of the Board of Trustees. This is clearly not the case. The Board of Trustees is an independent governing body. I would point out that the initial selection of the members of the Board of Trustees (who represent a diverse, cross-section of businessmen and businesswomen) exemplifies the integrity and independence of the Board of Trustees and the necessity that the Board of Trustees be an independent governing body. As specifically noted in Article IV, Section 1, of the Bylaws, the independence of the Board of Trustees is critical to ensure that Everglades College meets the needs of the communities in which it serves. Moreover, in order to further assure the independence of the Board of Trustees, the Bylaws provide that no more than two (2) members of the Board of Trustees may be related to a Director or an officer, and that no more than two (2) members of the Board of Trustees are allowed to be employees of Everglades College or to have any other business relationship with Everglades College. See Article IV, Section 3, of the Bylaws.

6. The agreement with AFS to provide flight training services to students at Everglades College was terminated on February 28, 2002. Everglades College is entering into a new agreement (College/Flight School Tuition Agreement) with the Association of Professional Flight Training Schools ("APFTS"), a consortium of flight schools. Enclosed is a draft of this new agreement with APFTS, together with a list of the APFTS members. Also enclosed are draft agreements (College/Flight School Agreements) between Everglades College and two of the APFTS members.
7. At the time of its acquisition in 1998, AFC, the for-profit predecessor to Everglades College, was a minimal, poorly-managed limited mission institution run by AFS. Following the purchase of AFC, which was subsequently converted in March, 2000, to Everglades College, a not-for-profit corporation, a strategic business plan was developed and a significant investment was made in its operations, including the appointment and training of a qualified management staff. This has contributed to Everglades College's increase in its student body from less than twenty students to close to two hundred students which, in turn, has resulted in a substantial increase in revenues and a concomitant increase in expenditures.

The foregoing is hereby submitted in response to your request for additional information.

I am hereby requesting that you allow a favorable determination letter to be issued regarding the tax-exempt status of Everglades College pursuant to Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended.

*Everglades College is a private, four-year, coeducational institution located in Fort Lauderdale, Florida. The college is accredited by the Accrediting Commission of Career Schools and Colleges of Technology (ACCSC) and licensed by the State Board of Independent Colleges and Universities (SBICU). Everglades College awards an Associate of Science degree in aviation studies and baccalaureate degrees in information technology and business administration. The College is totally designed for the working adult learner by providing a practical, hands-on education in a professional environment with schedules appropriate to the working adult.*

### DISTANCE LEARNING PROGRAM

Everglades College offers classes online and on campus. Students enrolled in Everglades College's online learning program have easy access to the latest online educational delivery methods. Courses are taken on the Internet, from home, office, or any convenient location at a time that fits a student's schedule.

### DELIVERY MEDIA

The online courses are designed by qualified faculty and staff members to create an interesting, interactive learning environment. The virtual classroom is confidential, and courses can be taken easily by anyone with access to the World Wide Web. Lesson plans, assignments, and class schedules are posted online, while student/teacher interaction and student/student interaction also occur over the Internet. Scheduled discussions, e-mail messages, live chats, streaming video, and group discussions are a few of the opportunities for interaction during online courses.

### PROGRAMS OF STUDY

Currently, all courses leading to an A.S. degree in aviation management are offered on line. These include

general education courses in English, communications, science, mathematics, and social and behavioral sciences, as well as required core classes. During the 2000-01 academic year, courses leading to bachelor's degrees in business administration and information technology will be added to Everglades College's online course offerings.

### SPECIAL PROGRAMS

Online students are enrolled in a free orientation class that provides simple instruction for making the most of the online learning environment. The help desk is available to online students via a toll-free number, twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week. Everglades College explores ongoing community and business partnerships that provide additional learning opportunities for students enrolled online or on campus. Students benefit from affiliations with organizations that offer additional educational resources, such as a statewide network of library consortia. Online students also have access to LIRN, a comprehensive, online library database.

### STUDENT SERVICES

Everglades College students have a wide variety of opportunities avail-

able both on-campus and online. An extensive placement program is available to current students and graduates that assists them in finding employment in their chosen fields. Registered employers can access student resumes online to help them identify graduates with appropriate skills. The online campus includes application and registration procedures, financial aid information, tuition and fee information, course schedules and descriptions, faculty information, and a chat room. Online students can access academic advising by phone or e-mail.

### CREDIT OPTIONS

Students may transfer credits taken at other accredited institutions if the course work is comparable, the faculty has appropriate degrees, and there is evidence of satisfactory scholarship (at least a C). The Dean of Academic Affairs evaluates transcripts and accepts credits on a course-by-course basis.

### FACULTY

## COLLEGE/FLIGHT SCHOOL TUITION AGREEMENT

The following tuition agreement is made between Everglades College, hereinafter "EVERGLADES" and the Association of Professional Flight Training Schools, hereinafter "APFTS".

"EVERGLADES" shall provide its college courses, and agrees to charge tuition for academic classes at the rate of \$250.00 per credit hour. The registration fee, and semester education fees will be waived. There will be a one time application fee of \$50.00.

These special tuition rates are only applicable to those students that are training at an "APFTS" member flight school, and are based upon the "APFTS" member flight schools collectively providing a minimum annual intake of 125 students.

This agreement will be mutually reviewed annually, (on contract anniversary date) to determine whether any adjustments are needed.

Students must meet all college admission requirements for entry into "EVERGLADES". In order to receive a degree from "EVERGLADES" students must complete all required flight courses, and complete either online or on campus, a minimum of 5 academic classes for the Associate Degree and a minimum of 10 academic classes for the Bachelors Degree.

## COLLEGE/FLIGHT SCHOOL AGREEMENT

This Contractual Agreement made this 1st day of March, 2002, is by and between Everglades College, an accredited academic institution and Florida not for profit corporation, hereinafter "EVERGLADES", and

Flying Colors Pilot Training, a corporation under the laws of The Province of Manitoba, hereinafter "FLIGHT SCHOOL" for the express purpose of executing the following agreement.

"FLIGHT SCHOOL" is a member of the Association of Professional Flight Training Schools (APFTS) and is licensed to provide flight training and ground instruction; and has agreed to maintain all necessary national/federal, state and local licenses/authorities required to operate a flight training school.

"FLIGHT SCHOOL" has, and agrees to maintain insurance of the character and in such amounts as are customarily required in the industry in its jurisdiction, and furthermore agrees to notify "EVERGLADES" in writing within 10 days of any changes, or diminution of its insurance or its status as a licensed/authorized flight school and/or any flight credentials currently held by its instructors.

"EVERGLADES" agrees to award college credit to students who successfully pass the required ground written exams and flight test exams for earning the certificates and ratings outlined in attachment A.

"EVERGLADES" further agrees to provide the collegiate program outlined in attachment A of academic courses leading to the award of either an Associate or Bachelor Degree.

"EVERGLADES" shall provide monthly progress reports to "FLIGHT SCHOOL" for the purpose of monitoring and ensuring satisfactory academic progress. "FLIGHT SCHOOL" agrees to follow all satisfactory progress standards as prescribed in "EVERGLADES" catalog and immediately report to "EVERGLADES" any student's failure to meet these standards. This process applies to both academic and attendance progress.
