The Black Maternal Health Momnibus is a comprehensive package of 12 bills crafted to eliminate racial disparities and improve maternal health across the board.



In the United States, Black women and birthing people are over three times as likely as white women to die from pregnancy-related causes. The Black Maternal Health Momnibus Act of 2021 is a package of twelve bills addressing the maternal health crisis the United States currently faces. The legislation advances critically important policies that cover various dimensions of maternal health among Black women, and makes robust investments to ensure quality health care and a myriad of social supports pregnant and postpartum women desperately need.
